To honor the 40th anniversary of the Milwaukee open housing ordinance and marches, the Hank Aaron State Trail worked with ten schools and several community groups to create public art along its Menomonee River Loop.

The artwork is beautiful and has totally transformed this area of the trail.

Come celebrate with the students, artists, and Friends of Hank Aaron State Trail and view this very special spot along the Trail and the Menomonee River.

Meet some of the original marchers that walked over the Sixteenth Street Viaduct (now appropriately named the James E. Groppi Unity Bridge) with Father Groppi and join us for snacks and refreshments.

Date: September 27th

Time: Drop by between 4:00 and 6:00 p.m.

Location: Trail entrance at Emmer Lane (13th and Canal Street – 3 blocks east of Potawatomi Casino)

Parking on marked areas of the street or in parking lots of adjacent businesses.

Also, available by Milwaukee County Transit route # 20. Get off at the stop in the middle of the James E. Groppi Unity Bridge (Sixteenth Street viaduct) and walk south to the stairway that will take you down to Canal Street. Then walk east to Emmer Lane (13th Street) and the entrance of the river loop section of the Hank Aaron State Trail.

After viewing our art exhibit, consider attending “March On Milwaukee”, a play written by Margaret Rozga, which entails remembrances of the 1967 marches for open and fair housing in Milwaukee. The location is the Scottish Rite Center (790 N. Van Buren) and the admission is \$10.00.
